Read for Spring riding? Keep these strange laws in mind!

1. The only game you can hunt from a motorcycle in Tennessee is Whale.
2. In Virginia, it is against the law to ride your motorcycle in a costume.
3. It is against the law in Arkansas to honk after 9 p.m. near a restaurant that sells cold sandwiches and drinks.
4. Motorcycles can travel in any direction on one-way streets as long you have a lantern attached.
5. In Youngstown, OH, you will face a ticket if you run out of gas.
6. It is a misdemeanor to curse while riding, or from any vehicle in Rockville, MD.
7. In Maine, Title 29-A-2062, prohibits anyone from intentionally raising up the front end of a motorcycle. (A “wheelie” or stunts)
8. When riding through Minnetonka, MN, it is a nuisance to have dirty tires. It impacts safety and general welfare.
9. Motorcycles can ride through red lights (after stopping) in many states that have the “Safe On Red” law. It’s due to the motorcycles’ inability to trigger traffic light sensors.
10. There is NO reading of comic books or graphic novels while riding in Oklahoma. It is regulated by distracted driving laws.

11. Alabama has a “No riding while blindfolded” law.

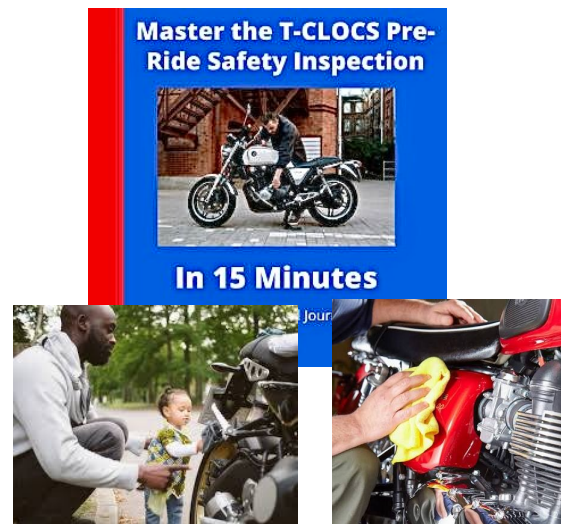
12. You best not screech your tires in Kansas! Punishment comes with a \$500 fine and up to 30 days in jail.

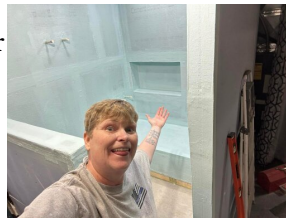

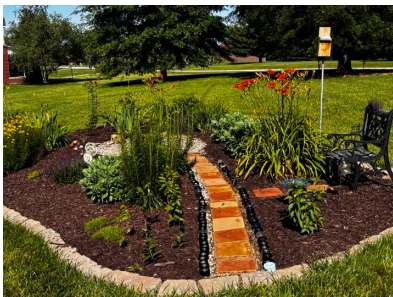
